the state average weekly wage of the next previous year, rounded off to the nearest \$.05. It is unlawful for any employer to require any employee to work more than 40 hours in one week, unless 1 1/2 times the regular hourly rate is paid for all work done over 40 hours in any one week, and whenever the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess of \$2:90 per hour, the minimum wage established under this section shall be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date as the increase highest federal minimum wage, but in no case shall the minimum wage exceed \$4 per hour. The overtime provision of this section shall not apply to seamen, ning, processing, preserving, freezing, marketing, storing, packing for shipment or the canning, drying, distribution of herring as sardines, of perishable foods, of agricultural produce and meat and fish products, nor to the canning of perishable goods, nor to hotels, motels, restaurants and other eating establishments, nor to public employees.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide for an increase in the minimum wage. In the first year the minimum wage would be increased by 10¢. In each subsequent year the minimum wage would be increased by the same percentage as the increase in the state average weekly wage, as determined by the Employment Security Commission.

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
