Currently, witnesses are paid \$10 per day for testifying in court. Many witnesses lose a full day's work and a full day's pay for testifying. This bill raises the minimum fee paid to a witness to partially compensate for this loss of pay. The mileage allowance is also raised to be consistent with that allowed state employees and to more adequately reflect the real travel expense to the witness.
