26 27 28 29	Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two-thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:
30 31	Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. 3, §23, as enacted by CR 1977, c. 5, is amended to read:
32 33 34 35	Section 23. Municipalities reimbursed annually. The Legislature shall annually reimburse each municipality from state tax sources for 50% fifty percent of the property tax revenue loss suffered by that

municipality during the previous calendar year because of statutory property tax exemptions or credits enacted after April 1, 1978. Reimbursement is not required for statutory property tax exemptions or credits relating to watercraft. The Legislature shall enact appropriate legislation to carry out the intent of this section.

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41 42 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to allow the State to create a property tax exemption for watercraft without being required to reimburse municipalities for fifty percent of the property tax revenue loss?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall if it appears that a majority of the returns and. legal votes are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on January 1, 1986.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This new draft would permit the State to exempt watercraft from property taxation without being required to reimburse municipalities for 50% of the property tax revenue loss. It is intended to be considered in conjunction with the new draft of L.D. 730 which would replace the property tax on boats with a municipality collected excise tax.

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
