the administrative expenses of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and the State Liquor Commission, authorizing expenditures for each fiscal year of the ensuing biennium and such other bills as may be required to provide the income necessary to finance the budget.

## Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7757 is enacted to read:

## §7757. Maine Fish and Game Fund

- 1. Establishment. There is established the Maine Fish and Game Fund. It shall receive money deposited by the Treasurer of State, pursuant to Title 36, section 5284. All money deposited in the fund, and the earnings thereon, shall remain in the fund to be used for the management of fish and game, and for necessary administrative and personnel costs associated therewith, and shall not be deposited in the General Fund or any other fund, except as specifically provided by statute.
- 2. Report and allocation. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall include a report on the Maine Fish and Game Fund as part of the report submitted to the Governor, pursuant to section 7034. The commissioner shall submit a budget for each biennium in accordance with Title 5, sections 1663 to 1666. The State Controller shall authorize expenditures from the fund as approved by the commissioner.
- 3. Work program. The Commissioner of Fisheries and Wildlife shall submit a work program for each fiscal year and semiannual progress reports the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wild-life. None of the money provided in this section may be expended unless the commissioner has approved the work program.

Prior to the beginning of the next year, he shall deduct the cost of administering the nongame 11 12 and fish and game checkoff, but not exceeding \$5,000 13 annually, and report the remainder to the Treasurer of State, who shall credit that amount to the Maine 14 Fish and Came Fund, which is established in Title 12, 15 16 section 7757.
- 17 Sec. 4. Application. This Act shall apply to income tax returns filed on or after January 1, 1984.

## 19 STATEMENT OF FACT

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The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is charged by law with the authority and responsibility for the management of all of the state's fish and game wildlife resources.

This bill permits individuals filing Maine income tax returns to make contributions through a voluntary checkoff to a fund designated for management of the fish and game species of the State.

The Maine Fish and Game Fund will be used by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for research and management of fish and game. It is intended that the term "management of fish and game" include enforcement of laws. Any start-up costs incurred by the department in anticipation of implementing this program may be reimbursed from the fund.

Twenty states now have nongame checkoffs on their income tax forms. Experience in these states has shown that a large number of taxpayers are willing to donate funds for nongame management. It is felt that many active and nonactive hunters, fishermen,

trappers etc. would be willing to donate to a fish and game fund for the management of fish and game resources of this State. This bill permits donations to support both inland and marine species of fish and game.

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
