27	Registers of deeds in the several counties shall
28	receive annual salaries as set forth in Title 307
29	section 2.
30	The salaries of the registers of deeds shall be
31	in full compensation for the performance of all offi-
32	cial duties and no other fees or compensation shall
33	may be allowed them. All registers, except in the

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1 western district of Oxford County; shall devote their 2 entire time to the duties of the office, unless the 3 county commissioners and the county budget committee 4 determine otherwise. They shall account monthly under oath to the county treasurers for all fees 5 6 received by them or payable to them by virtue of the 7 office, specifying the items, and shall pay the whole amount of the same to the treasurers of their respec-8 9 tive counties monthly by the 15th day of the follow-They may make abstracts and copies 10 ing month. from the records and furnish the same to persons calling 11 12 for them and may charge a reasonable fee for such 13 service, but shall not give an opinion upon the title 14 to real estate.

15 Registers shall photocopy each warranty or quit-16 claim deed received and send the copy to the asses-17 sors of the appropriate municipality within 30 days 18 of recordation. They may charge a reasonable fee for 19 such service.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

21 This bill establishes appointed county treasurers 22 in each county. The county commissioners are granted 23 the appointive authority. The salary of the county 24 treasurer is to be a responsibility of the county 25 budget committee. Appointed county treasurers must 26 be qualified in business administration and finance. Statutes referring to the election of county treas-27 28 urers or to the appointment of county treasurers sub-29 ject to referendum are repealed.

30 This bill establishes appointed registers of 31 deeds in each county. The county commissioners are 32 granted the appointive authority. The salary of the 33 register of deeds is to be a responsibility of the 34 county budget committee.

This bill repeals provisions in the statutes for elected registers of deeds and grants to the county commissioners and the budget committee the authority to determine their hours.

39 This bill coincides with legislation submitted to 40 establish county budget committees. 1 The Blaine House Conference on State and Local 2 Relations held on May 10 and 11, 1982, identified 3 county government as an area where reform is needed. 4 This and related legislation implements the confer-5 ence recommendations for county reform by focusing on 6 2 changes:

7 1. Control of the county budget should rest with 8 local officials; and

9 2. Administrative offices at the county level 10 which are now elected positions should be appointed 11 positions.

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
