SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 470, L.D. 1434,
Bill, "AN ACT to Reassign Responsibilities Within the
Department of Environmental Protection."

Amend the bill in section 4 by striking out the
last underlined sentence (page 2, lines 36 and 37 in
L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'The Governor shall appoint one member to serve as
chairman.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment allows the Governor to designate
one member of the Board of Environmental Protection
as the chairman. The Board of Environmental Protec-
tion is the 2nd most powerful regulatory body in
Maine and the policies it establishes reflect on the
Governor. The Governor should be able to designate
the person who will be viewed as the leader of the
board.
