confidential. Those records may only be released with the express written permission of the patron involved or as the result of a court order.

 Libraries shall have up to 5 years from the effective date of this chapter to be in compliance with this section.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this new draft is to protect libraries from having to disclose information on borrowers and the library material they use. Because of the way records are maintained, it will take up to 5 years for libraries to purge existing records which are readily accessible to members of the public - i.e.; check out cards in the back of books, etc.

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
