22 23 24 25	This amendment makes the 2nd or subsequent offense within one year or dissemination to a juvenile under 14 years of age a felony. A Class C crime carries a penalty of up to 5 years in jail and a fine

up to \$2,500, or \$10,000 if the defendant is a partnership, corporation or unincorporated association.
