## STATEMENT OF FACT

7 This bill enables the Department of Environmental 8 Protection to continue providing solid waste techni-9 cal assistance to municipalities. The existing tech-10 nical assistance program was established by the 110th 11 Legislature as a pilot program to help municipalities 12 analyze and correct problems with their landfills by 13 providing technical expertise not readily available 14 in most communities. Since the program began, the 15 Department of Environmental Protection has helped 16 several municipalities solve operational problems at 17 their landfills, and has hired consultants to perform 18 geologic analyses, test ground water and solve drainage problems at a number of sites. This bill 19 makes 20 the technical assistance program a continuing one.

21 This bill is also a response to the suggestions 22 and concerns raised by local officials at the Blaine 23 House Conference on State and Local Relations. Funds carry out the purposes of this subsection will be 24 to 25 appropriated from the General Fund within the Part II 26 Budget.

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
