STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill increases from \$25 to \$75 the amount of 3 money paid to commissioners per meeting attended if 4 the board adopts the administrator law. The adminis-5 trator law which was enacted in 1975 allows board а 6 of county commissioners to hire a county administrator, but if it does, the board members shall 7 forqo their annual salaries in place of \$25 per meeting 8 9 attended. Since the law was enacted, the Legislature has increased the duties and responsibilities of 10 11 county commissioners in such areas as employee relations, labor relations, purchasing and general over-12 sight over the operation of all county offices. 13

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
