HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 512, L.D. 1529,  
Bill, "AN ACT to Extend Maine's Returnable Deposit  
Law."

Amend the Bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in  
the 5th and 6th lines (page 1, lines 29 and 30 in  
L.D.) by striking out the following: "in 12 fluid  
ounce metal beverage containers and"

Further amend the Bill in section 2 in subsection  
2 in the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 7 and 8 in L.D.)  
by striking out the following: "only a 12 fluid ounce  
metal beverage container" and inserting in its place  
the following: "a glass, metal or plastic bottle,  
can, jar or other container which has been sealed by  
a manufacturer and which, at the time of sale, con-  
tains 7 fluid ounces or more, but less than 13 fluid  
ounces"

This amendment includes all individual servings  
of fruit and tea drinks which are sold in stores,  
vending machines, etc. As written, the bill only  
includes 12 ounce metal containers and would not  
include similar drinks in glass bottles or other than  
12 ounce size.
