20 21 22 23	AN ACT Relating to the Appointment of a Policy Review Board for the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf.
24 25 26	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
27 28 29 30 31	Whereas, it has been recognized that the input of private citizens regarding the operation of the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf is important to the school's function and the need for a Policy Review Board to be appointed immediately; and
32 33 34	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following

- 2 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
- 3 therefore,
- 4 it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 5 follows:
- 6 Sec. 1. 20 MRSA §3122, sub-§4, as amended by PL7 1977, c. 325, §1, is further amended to read:
- 8 Governor Baxter School for the Deaf. The Governor Baxter School for the Deaf, established by chapter 446 of the private and special laws of 1897 9 10 11 and by chapter 44 of the private and special laws of 12 1953, is to be devoted to the education and instruc-13 tion of deaf children. The school shall be located in 14 the County of Cumberland and the State shall have the 15 entire charge, responsibility and expense of main-16 taining the school. The government of the school 17 vested in the Department of Educational and Cultural 18 Services, which shall have charge of the general 19 the school and that its interests of shall see 20 affairs are conducted in accordance with law. 21 department may employ officers, teachers and other 22 employees as it may deem advisable subject to the 23 Personnel Law. The department may prescribe the sys-24 tem of education and course of study to be pursued in 25 the school.
- 26 Any child between the ages of 5 and 20 years, as 27 fined in section 3123, subsection 1, diagnosed as 28 deaf, shall be educated with regular students when-29 ever possible and shall be educated under the principle of the least restrictive educational 30 tive as set forth in state and federal laws and regu-31
- 32 lations.
- 33 The superintendent of the administrative unit in 34 which such child resides, with the consent 35 child's parent or guardian may enroll such legal 36 child in the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf the sums necessary for the support of such child 37 38 while attending the school shall be paid by the 39 Department of Educational and Cultural Services in

- 1 It shall be the responsibility of the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf to provide annual evaluation of 2 3 all children enrolled in the school. These evaluations shall be sent to the 4 superintendents of the 5 administrative units from which such children are 6 enrolled. Each administrative unit may request tech-7 nical assistance from the Governor Baxter School for 8 the Deaf in matters relating to the education of deaf 9 children in accordance with guidelines and regulations of the department. 10
- The Governor shall appoint a 7-member Policy Review 11 12 Board to review amd make recommendations relative to the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf. The board 13 shall have access to the school, but may not partici-14 pate in the administration of the day-to-day operations of the school. The board shall make annual 15 16 17 recommendations to the commissioner relative to management of the school with copies being sent to 18 the members of the joint standing committee 19 20 Legislature having jurisdiction over education. The 21 board's specific duties include, but are not limited 22 to:
- A. Making policy recommendations to the superintendent and the commissioner;
- 25 B. Reviewing policy development by the superin-26 tendent and commissioner;
- 27 C. Reviewing the implementation of policy;
- D. Reviewing staff recruitment, retention, promotion and evaluation policies and procedures;
- 30 E. Holding hearings for staff, parents, stu-31 dents, alumni, special education directors and 32 general public and otherwise soliciting the opin-33 ions of individuals in those groups concerning 34 the operation and role of the school; and
- F. Conducting exit interviews with the staff members terminating employment with the school.
- The board members shall be representative of a broad range of professionals, parents and citizens interested in education of deaf and hearing

The initial appointments shall be 3 members for 3 years, 2 members for 2 years and 2 members for one year. The board shall serve without pay, other than their actual expenses while carrying out the functions of the board.

26 27	8. Policy Review Board. The Governor shall appoint a 7-member Policy Review Board.
28	A. The term of office shall be 3 years.
29	B. The initial appointments shall be as follows:
30	(1) Three members for 3 years;
31	(2) Two members for 2 years; and
32	(3) Two members for one year.

1 2 3	C. Replacements for board members who do not complete their term of office shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term.
4 5	D. No member of the Legislature may serve on the board.
6 7 8 9	E. The board members shall be representative of a broad range of professionals, parents and citizens interested in the education of deaf and hearing impaired students. They may include:

  - (7) Conducting exit interviews with the staff members terminating employment with the school.
- 16 H. The board shall serve without pay, other than 17 their actual expenses while carrying out the 18 functions of the board.

## §41. Membership; rights and recommendations

A board of 5 visitors, as heretefere established, shall be appointed by the Governor, in connection with each state institution under the department the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf within the Department of Educational and Eultural Services. These visitors shall be appointed for a term of one year and shall be eligible for reappointment. No member of the Legislature shall may serve on any Board of Visitors. The members of the Boards of Visitors shall receive no compensation. Each Board of Visitors shall have the right to inspect the institution to which it is assigned and to make recommendations relative to the management of said the institution to the commissioner. Copies of all recommendations shall be sent to the members of the Health and Institutional Services Committee of the Legislature and each Board of Visitors shall appear before the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Institutional Services upon request.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, sections 1 and 3 of this Act shall take effect when approved and section 2 shall take effect July 2, 1983.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This new draft eliminates the Board of Visitors for the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf under the Revised Statutes, Title 24 and establishes a Policy Review Board for the school. It specifies the term of office as 3 years and the number of members as 7. It makes recommendations for membership on the board but leaves the appointments up to the Governor. It specifies certain duties for the board.

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
