31 of Maine; 2 members from faculty at the University of 32 Maine campuses, only one of whom can be from the 33 Orono or University of Southern Maine campuses; one 34 student currently enrolled at a Maine college or university; one alumnus from a Maine college or university; 3 members of the general public; and one professional and one classified employee from the University of Maine.

5 Sec. 2. Appointment. The members shall be 6 appointed as follows: The 2 members of the House of 7 Representatives shall be appointed by the Speaker of 8 the House of Representatives; the Senate member shall 9 be appointed by the President of the Senate; adminis-10 trators shall be appointed by the University of Maine 11 trustees; the faculty, student, professional and classified members shall be elected by the respective 12 13 bodies in the University of Maine system; the alumni 14 and public members shall be appointed by the Gover-15 nor. The Governor shall appoint the chairman of the 16 commission.

17 Sec. 3. Duties. The commissioner shall evaluate 18 the cost and performance of the University of Maine 19 with specific attention paid to:

<u>1. Faculty.</u> The quality and morale of faculty;
 the recruitment, retention and promotion of faculty;
 and the impact of collective bargaining;

23 <u>2. Decision making.</u> The planning and decision-24 making processes of institutions of higher education;

25 <u>3. Service.</u> The delivery of services to stu-26 dents and the general public by institutions of 27 higher education; the costs of the delivery of educa-28 tional services; and the costs of administration;

<u>4. Quality of education.</u> The overall quality of
 education offered at these institutions; the appro priateness of the curriculum for needs of students,
 the State and the Nation; and

<u>5. Other matters.</u> Such other matters and considerations as the commission shall deem appropriate
in providing to the Legislature a full and accurate
picture of the subject matter of higher education in
this State.

38 Sec. 4. Staff assistance. The commission may 39 hire outside consultants to gather information, con1 duct interviews and undertake any other activities 2 necessary to fulfill the commission's charge. The 3 commission may hold any public hearings it deems 4 appropriate in obtaining information deemed neces-5 sary.

6 findings and recommenda-Sec. 5. Report on The Commission on Higher Education shall com-7 tions. 8 plete its work and report its findings and recom-9 mendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Education, any necessary implementing legislation on 10 or before January 1, 1985, to the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. This report shall address 11 12 each of the matters set forth in this Act and shall 13 include any proposed legislation in proper draft form 14 15 to be adopted by the Legislature to effectuate the 16 course of action the commission may recommend.

17 The report shall include a recodification of the 18 public laws and private and special laws governing 19 the University of Maine system and their incorpo-20 ration into the Revised Statutes, Title 20-A.

21 Sec. 6. Compensation. Members shall be compen-22 sated at \$40 for each day or part of a day they par-23 ticipate in commission business, plus reasonable 24 travel expenses.

25 Sec. 7. Appropriation. The following funds are 26 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 27 purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

32 The purpose of this new draft is to establish a 33 commisison to review and evaluate the University of 34 Maine system. This will be the first major study of 35 higher education in Maine since the formation of the 36 University of Maine system in 1968. The commission is 37 directed to report to the Legislature with its report 1 and recommendations for legislative action by January
2 1, 1985.
