A complimentary license to hunt or fish, or a combination hunt-6 ing and fishing license, shall be issued to any resi-7 dent of Maine who is 70 years of age or older 8 9 applies for it to the commissioner. STATEMENT OF FACT

Sections 1 and 2 update Title 12, sections 7034 and 7051 to reflect a change in procedure which has taken place within the Department of Personnel.

Section 3 establishes uniform expiration dates on hunting and fishing licenses issued to Maine residents over 70 years of age and allows for a single annual mailing of computerized renewal forms.

Section 4 provides that complimentary hunting and fishing licenses for resident paraplegics be issued on a 3-year basis in the same manner as other complimentary licenses.

Section 5 establishes uniform expiration dates on hunting and fishing licenses issued to disabled war veterans and allows for a single annual mailing of computerized renewal forms.

Section 6 eliminates all reference to the old Department of Mental Health and Corrections in regard to the issuance of free fishing licenses. The new Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation is no longer responsible for the administration of correctional programs, and the exceptions listed for correctional facilities in this portion of the statutes are no longer appropriate.

Section 7 makes it clear that the commissioner may refuse to renew the license of any person convicted of a violation of the fish and wildlife laws.

Section 8 eliminates the requirement that an application for a nonresident junior hunting license be accompanied by written consent of a parent or quardian.

Section 9 makes it clear that all bass clubs, including those which are located outside of Maine, must obtain a permit prior to conducting a one-day bass tournament.

Section 11. There are certain species of amphibians and reptiles which, for reasons of public safety, are allowed importation into this State only for purposes of exhibition. This section clarifies the intent of Title 12, section 7231 and helps ensure that dangerous amphibians and reptiles will not find their way into the pet industry.

Section 12 changes the marking provisions for wild birds which are imported by commercial shooting areas. The proposed change is consistent with a bill already enacted during the current legislative session which changed the marking requirements for imported pheasants and wild birds held in captivity by licensed breeders.

Section 13 makes it clear that it is unlawful for any person to hunt within the right-of-way of any controlled access highway.

Section 14 makes it clear that the commissioner has authority to authorize beekeepers to protect beehives from bear damage.

Section 15 repeals a fishing statute concerning the Kennebec River which is already covered by special rule. One section of the rule is more liberal than the statute and this section will resolve that inconsistency.

Section 16. Legal requirement that ice fishing lines be kept under the immediate supervision of the person who set them has created considerable confusion both among fishermen and law enforcement officers. The purpose of this section is to clarify the meaning of the term "immediate supervision" as it applies to ice fishing.

Section 17 makes it clear that all bait traps and bait holding boxes must be marked with the name and address of the owner. Previously this provision applied only to licensed bait dealers and not to

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18 19 Section 20 resolves recent law enforcement problems by making it clear that, unless otherwise specifically provided, it is unlawful to train dogs outside the open training season.

Section 21 establishes consistent penalty provisions for all violations of Title 12, chapters 701 to 721, which involve nuisance dogs.

Section 22 is to revise the penalty provisions of the stream alteration laws to make them consistent with the penalty sections of other environmental laws.

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
