21 22 23	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
24 25	Whereas, additional periodic enforcement of the marine resources laws are needed; and
26 27	Whereas, this need cannot adequately be filled by the existing number of marine patrol officers; and
28 29	Whereas, it is vitally necessary that these enforcement needs be met; and
30 31 32 33	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

- vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
 therefore,
- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 4 follows:
 - 12 MRSA §6028 is enacted to read:

- §6028. Volunteer marine patrol officers
- 1. Appointment. The commissioner may appoint volunteer marine patrol officers upon such conditions as the commissioner may determine. Volunteer marine patrol officers shall serve without compensation and may be paid actual automobile costs at the rate paid to state employees.
- 2. Powers and duties. Volunteer marine patrol officers shall have the same powers and duties as marine patrol officers specified in section 6025, except that the exercise of these powers and duties shall be limited to marine resources laws set out in chapters 601 to 627, inclusive, and department regulations adopted pursuant to these statutes. Volun-teer marine patrol officers shall complete reserve officer training at the Maine Criminal Justice Academy pursuant to Title 25, section 2805-A prior to assuming these duties. They may carry firearms during the performance of these duties.
- **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited 26 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 27 approved.

28 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides an inexpensive and flexible means for the Department of Marine Resources to supplement its existing complement of marine patrol officers. Volunteer marine patrol officers would be used primarily during the extremely busy summer months to broaden and supplement the range of the department's enforcement efforts. Their use would be targeted toward seasonal responsibilities such as Atlantic salmon and striped bass regulations.

Similar programs are used in the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, in Vermont and Pennsylvania.

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
