No person, unless employed in the telephone business or employed by the corporation, and their immediate families, shall may become a shareholder and the by-laws bylaws of the corporation shall, subject to the approval of the Bank Commissioner Superintendent of Banking, contain provisions to carry into effect this section. Shares of capital stock may be subscribed and paid for in such manner as the by-laws bylaws may prescribe except that the par value of shares shall not

- 1 exceed \$5. The maximum amount of shares which may be 2 held by any one member shall be established from time 3 to time by resolution of the board of directors.
- 4 Sec. 2. P&SL 1921, c. 93, §4, first sentence is amended to read:

All the corporate powers of this corporation shall be exercised by a board of directors, who shall be shareholders and a majerity of whom shall be residents of this State and who shall be elected by the shareholders.

11 STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to authorize certain amendments to the charter of the Telephone Workers Credit Union of Maine which have been suggested by the Bureau of Banking. The Telephone Workers Credit Union of Maine is one of 3 Maine credit unions chartered by the Maine Legislature. Accordingly, any changes in the charter of the credit union require prior legislative authorization.

The charter amendments being proposed are technical in nature. The amendments would:

- 1. Allow credit union employees and the family members of such employees to join the credit union as members;
- 25 2. Remove the \$5 par value per share require-26 ment, allowing the board of directors to require a 27 higher entrance fee, the actual entrance fee to be 28 approved by the banking superintendent; and
- 3. Require all directors to be Maine residents, the same as is presently required of all Maine credit unions which do not require legislative charter.

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
