The fact-finding proceedings shall be as provided by section 965, subsection 3, except that the panel shall have a period of 90 days in which to hear the contending parties to the controversy. That 90-day period shall commence upon the first scheduled hearing called by the panel.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this new draft is to shorten the fact-finding process under the State Employees Labor Relations Act by limiting the period in which the fact-finding panel may hear the contending parties to 90 days, rather than the present unlimited time. This will provide a reasonable time frame in which to hold hearings, thus limiting the length of the process, yet not restricting the panel's time in which to consider arguments or to prepare recommendations.

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
