18 AN ACT to Establish Funding for Programs
19 of Preventive Intervention and Family Support.

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
22 follows:

23 Sec. 1. 30 MRSA §2352, sub-§2, as amended by PL
24 1979, c. 562, §11, is further amended to read:

25 2. Marriage intentions and license. Recording
26 marriage intentions and issuing a marriage license,
27 ~~at \$20~~ \$20, except, where the laws of this State require
28 2 licenses, the fee shall be ~~\$5~~ \$10 each. Ten
29 dollars of the \$20 fee or \$5 of the \$10 fee shall be
30 delivered monthly by the clerk of the town to the
31 Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation,
32 Office of Children's Services, which shall distribute
33 these revenues to programs or agencies providing pre-
34 vention, intervention or support services to families
35 that include infants or young children;

1 \$120,000, based on the number of licenses issued in
2 1982. This amount will be disbursed to the commit-
3 tee.

4 STATEMENT OF FACT

5 This new draft corrects the statutory reference
6 to the marriage license fee. The fee is increased by
7 \$10, which the clerk of the municipality shall send
8 on a monthly basis to the Office of Children's Ser-
9 vices.

10 The funds will be distributed by the Interdepart-
11 mental Coordinating Committee for Preschool Handi-
12 capped Children, according to promulgated rules to
13 agencies providing services to families, infants and
14 children at risk, as defined in this new draft. The
15 Interdepartmental Coordinating Committee for Pre-
16 school Handicapped Children will also establish a
17 program plan, which must be approved by the commis-
18 sioners of the 3 departments involved with preschool
19 children and promulgated according to Maine Adminis-
20 trative Procedure Act provisions.

21 The Interdepartmental Coordinating Committee for
22 Preschool Handicapped Children will report annually
23 on its activities to the Joint Standing Committee on
24 Health and Institutional Services.
