AN ACT to Create a Maine Commission on Excellence in Education.
Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
Whereas, the purpose of this Act is to create a commission to examine the quality of education in this State in light of the recent report of the National Commission on the Excellence in Education; and
Whereas, this commission should make its report to the Governor, Legislature and the people of this State; and
Whereas, the commission must commence the performance of its duties immediately if it is to complete

the review in time to propose necessary legislative changes to the Second Regular Session of the 111th Legislature; and

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42 43 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Commission; duties. The Maine sion on Excellence in Education shall be created to make recommendations to the Governor, the public State and the Second Regular Session of the 111th Legislature concerning policies, laws and practices which should be adopted to insure excellence in the educational system in this State. The commission shall review the work of the National Commission Excellence in Education to determine its applicability to public education in Maine. The commission assess the quality of teaching and learning throughout the public educational system of State, but give particular attention to the course of elementary, secondary and vocational in schools; identify educational programs and opportunities which result in notable student success in lege or vocational training schools; assess degree to which student performance in has schools improved and identify proposals declined or encourage improvement; and define problems in our educational system which must be overcome in current order to pursue a course of excellence in education. This review shall culminate in a report that includes specific recommendations, suggested methods of implementation, and the costs and methods of funding its proposals, whether by public or private means. report, including necessary legislation, shall be made to the Governor and the Legislature by January 31, 1984.

Sec. 2. Membership. The membership of the commission shall consist of 21 persons: The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the

1 Senate shall jointly appoint a chairman; 2 members 2 trained as educators and currently teaching elemen-3 tary and secondary schools; 2 members, each of whom 4 is currently serving as an elected member of a local 5 school board; one member from the State Board of Edu-6 cation; the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural 7 Services, or his designee; one member who 8 teacher educator in a state college or university; 9 representative of a private college: 10 Chancellor of the University of Maine, or his desig-11 nee; one member who is a school administrator; 12 vocational educator; and 5 members of the public. 13 The Speaker of the House of Representatives and 14 President of the Senate are directed to seek the 15 broadest diversity of membership considering both 16 and rural representation and type of educa-17 tional experience or interest. Two members 18 Senate shall be chosen by the President of the Senate 2 members of the House of Representatives shall 19 be chosen by the Speaker of the House of Representa-20 21 tives.

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The commission shall be Sec. 3. Meetings. appointed promptly and the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate shall notify all members of the time and place of the first At that time, the commission shall organmeeting. ize, elect a vice-chairman and secretary-treasurer, adopt rules as to the administration of the commission and its affairs and thereafter shall often as necessary until its work is completed. The commission may organize subcommittees as needed In all matters as to which out its duties. carry there is a disagreement, a majority vote shall and a quorum shall consist of at least 11 memvail of bers. The commission shall maintain minutes meetings and such financial records as may be required by the State Auditor.

Sec. 4. Public hearings; meetings. The commission shall hold at least 3 public hearings throughout the State in order to seek public participation in its deliberations and prior to the issuance of the final report.

Sec. 5. Assistance. The commission may employ such clerical assistance as needed to carry out its

The Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services and the Chancellor of the University of Maine system are directed to provide maximum assistance possible in light of current funding in order to reduce the commission's need for outside consultants.
8 9 10 11 12	Sec. 6. Reimbursement of expenses. The members of the commission shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for their reasonable expenses in attending meetings, procuring supplies and other related and necessary expenditures.
13 14 15	Sec. 7. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
