23 24	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
25	5 MRSA §7002, sub-§2, ¶K is enacted to read:

The director may make grants or enter into contracts for job development training from funds established by appropriations therefor, to any appropriately licensed and accredited institution of learning, including private and proprietary colleges; the state university system; the vocational-technical institutes and vocational regions and centers; and businesses offering
34	organized and established training programs, pro-

vided that these funds shall be awarded only to cover the necessary expenses of developing and implementing training programs for individuals and firms, partnerships or corporations and their employees.

The director shall submit to the Governor, not later than January 15th of each year, a complete report on activities relating to the Job Development Training Fund, including an audited accounting of its receipts and expenditures, assets and liabilities, at the end of its fiscal year.

The Legislature shall make annual appropriations to the State Development Office for the purposes of this paragraph. Funds expended shall not lapse but shall be carried forward.

## FISCAL NOTE

Funding for this new draft will come from the General Fund and has been included in the Governor's Part II Budget request. Two hundred and fifty thousand dollars for each of fiscal years 1984 and 1985 will be required to operate the Job Development Training Fund.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The future health of the Maine economy will depend in part upon the state's success in helping existing and new businesses to acquire a skilled labor force. The job development fund will help demonstrate the state's commitment to this end and will better meld our job attraction and job training programs. Specifically, the job development fund will be used to train or retrain labor for businesses in the process of expanding and to recruit and train

labor for new businesses locating in the State. By using existing educational institutions and businesses experienced in providing training, the programs will help avoid a costly duplication of training space and equipment and will need no administrative structure.

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
