27 Sec. 14. Reduction of revenue. In the event 28 that actual revenue fails to equal estimates during 29 either year of the biennium, the commissioner shall 30 so report to the Governor and he may temporarily cur-31 tail allotments so that expenditures will not exceed 32 the anticipated income.

33 Sec. 15. Revenue in excess of estimates. Actual 34 revenue, in excess of that estimated and approved by 35 the Legislature, received in either year of the bien-36 nium may be utilized by the department for current

1 programs when recommended by the commissioner and the 2 allotment of these funds is approved by the Governor.

3 Sec. 16. Unencumbered allocated balances. At 4 the end of each year of the biennium, all unencum-5 bered allocated balances, including existing balances, representing inland fisheries and wildlife 6 7 moneys shall be set aside in a separate account and 8 may be used for other current programs when recommended by the commissioner and the allotment of these 9 10 funds is approved by the Governor.

Sec. 17. New programs established by the 111th 11 12 Legislature. In the event that legislation concern-13 ing the department is enacted by the 111th Legis-14 lature which requires an expenditure in addition to that now shown in section 11, the department is 15 16 authorized to carry out the intent of the legislation 17 through the use of such funds as are available. The same procedure as to the allotment of these funds shall be followed as that outlined in sections 11 and 18 19 20 12.

21 Sec. 18. Effective Date. This Act shall become 22 effective on January 1, 1984.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is a dedicated revenue department which is largely dependent on license fees to fund fish and wildlife law enforcement, management and research programs.

The most recent adjustment in fees on general hunting and fishing licenses became effective on January 1, 1980. Since that time, high inflation rates and employee pay raises mandated by collective bargaining agreements have increased the annual operating expenses of the department from less than 7 million dollars to approximately 9 million dollars. 1 The license fee changes proposed in this amend-2 ment will increase department revenues by approxi-3 mately \$480,996 in fiscal year 1984 and \$1,603,319 in 4 fiscal year 1985 annually and will enable the depart-5 ment to continue to provide current services. The 6 total for the biennium is \$2,084,315.
