23 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
24 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
25 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

26 Whereas, recent federal interpretation of United
27 States Public Law 97-300 as enacted by Congress Octo-
28 ber 13, 1982, indicates Maine's employment security
29 law does not conform at this time to United States
30 Public Law 97-300, Section 302; and

31 Whereas, this lack of conformity could result in
32 the loss of unemployment benefits unjustly to indi-
33 viduals attempting to become employed through enter-
34 ing into temporary skills training programs which
35 will provide the skills necessary for secure employ-
36 ment; and
