It shall be the 5. 17 responsibility of the state agency that incurs a late fee pursuant to this chapter to calculate the amount of the late fee and add that fee to the amount of the invoice prior to submission of the invoice to the controller. In calculating the amount of the late fee which will be added to the invoice, the state 18 19 20 21 22 23 agency shall assume and calculate an additional late 24 fee equivalent to the 12 working days necessary for 25 the invoice to be processed by the controller. 26 Further amend the Bill in that part designated "§1554." in the first paragraph, in the 5th line 27 28 (page 4, line 5 in L.D.) by striking out the under-29 lined words "a late fee" and inserting in their place the following: 'a reasonable late fee that shall not exceed the normal late charge that the business con-30 31 cern levies 32 33 Further amend the Bill in that part designated "§1554." by striking out all of the 2nd paragraph and 34 35 inserting in its place the following: 36 'In the event that federal moneys are the bud-

geted source of funds for payment to business concerns for state agency purchases of goods, property or services, and these moneys are unexpectedly withheld and delayed from reaching the State in time to pay proper invoices without incurring a late fee, the state agency which made the purchases and the State of Maine shall not be liable for any late fees on overdue payments.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

10 The purpose of this amendment is to transfer the administrative burden of calculating late fee charges 11 from the Department of Finance and Administration to 12 13 each state agency which incurs the late fee. In ad-14 dition, this amendment removes the flat rate ceiling 15 the late charge and substitutes the late fee on charge that a business concern normally charges to 16 17 all of its customers.

18 Liability of the State for late payments is also 19 removed on the conditions that a state agency had 20 budgeted federal funds for payment to a business con-21 cern and the federal funds are unexpectedly withheld 22 and delayed from arriving in time to pay proper in-23 voices without incurring a late fee.

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
