11 STATEMENT OF FACT

 This bill permits the consolidation of District Courts in Bath and Brunswick into one judicial facility to serve both communities, which are less than 10 miles apart. It also realigns the communities of Pownal and Yarmouth into the Southern Cumberland District Court, Portland, which is more convenient to the public and law enforcement officers in those communities.
