10 11	Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:
12 13 14	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
15 16	Whereas, plantations now must hold their annual meeting in March; and
17 18	Whereas, the annual meeting is the meeting at which officers are elected; and
19 20 21	Whereas, plantations would prefer to hold their annual meeting along with their business meeting for adoption of a budget; and
22 23 24	Whereas, plantations would prefer to hold their business meeting in conjunction with the school business meeting which is held in June; and
25 26 27	Whereas, the intent of the bill is to allow plantations to hold meetings at a more convenient time; and
28 29 30	Whereas, the enactment of this bill would permit plantations to change their annual meeting date this spring; and
31 32 33 34	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

3 4	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:
5 6 7	'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'
8	STATEMENT OF FACT
9 10 11	The purpose of this amendment is to allow municipalities to change their annual meeting dates this year.
