21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35	Every retail licensee shall keep for 2 years com- plete records separate and apart from records relat- ing to any other transactions engaged in by the licensee showing the date of all purchases, the actu- al prices paid therefor and the fact that the licens- ee paid cash for all liquor bought by him at the time of or prior to delivery of such liquor, together with the name and address of every person from whom such the liquor was purchased. In the case of wholesal- ers, records shall be kept for 2 years in the princi- pal licensed establishment of the wholesale licensee

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1 showing that all sales and purchases are in accord-2 ance with the law relating to cash sales, including 3 detailed accounts of all its transactions with brew-4 ers, wineries, other wholesalers and retailers. In 5 the case of certificate of approval licensees operat-6 special warehouse storage facilities within this ing 7 State, complete records shall be kept and maintained 8 upon the premise relating to all transactions con-9 ducted at the special warehouse storage facility, showing the date and amounts of all liquors received 10 11 and from whom they were received, as well as the 12 dates and amounts of all liquors shipped or withdrawn 13 and the name of the person for whom such the liquor 14 was shipped or withdrawn. All such records shall be open to the commission, its representatives or repre-15 16 sentatives of the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement of the 17 Department of Public Safety at any time and the com-18 mission, its representatives or representatives of 19 said the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement shall have the 20 right to make copies thereof which may be used as ev-21 idence of violation of this section.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to allow wholesalers of beer and soft drinks to place both beer and soft drinks on the same invoice, eliminating added time and expense.

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
