17 18 19	AN ACT Relating to State Preemption in the Area of Firearms Regulation.
20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22	25 MRSA §2043 is enacted to read:
23	§2043. State preemption
24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31	1. State preemption. The State hereby occupies and preempts the entire field of legislation touching in any way firearms, components, ammunition and sup- plies to the complete exclusion of any order, ordi- nance or regulation by any political subdivision of this State. Any existing or future orders, ordi- nances or regulations in this field are null and void, except as provided in chapter 253.
32 33	2. Regulation by political subdivisions prohib- ited. No county, city, town, village, municipality

or other political subdivision of this State may adopt any order, ordinance or regulation concerning in any way the sale, purchase, purchase delay, transfer, ownership, use, keeping, possession, bearing, transportation, licensing, permit, registration, taxation or other controls on firearms, components, ammunition and supplies.

8 <u>3. Certain ordinances permitted. Nothing con-</u> 9 tained in this section may prohibit any ordinance of 10 any political subdivision which requires citizens or 11 public employees to be armed for personal or national 12 defense, law enforcement or other lawful purposes.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

Presently, a number of Maine municipalities have a variety of weapons' laws that result in confusion on the part of the public and unfairness to businessmen who sell weapons. This bill requires legislative action on all weapons' laws, making these laws consistent statewide.
