21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	17 MRSA §314, 2nd ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1981, c. 395, is amended to read:
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35	The fee for such a license to any nonprofit organization is \$3 for each calendar week, or portion thereof, that the amusement is to be operated, or the license may be issued for a calendar month for a fee of \$12.50. All license fees shall be paid to the Treasurer of State to be credited to the General Fund. No licenses may be assignable or transferable. Nothing contained in this section is to be construed to prohibit any volunteer fire department or any agricultural fair association or bona fide nonprofit charitable, educational, political, civic, recrea-

tional, fraternal, patriotic, religious or veterans' organization from obtaining licenses for a period not to exceed 6 months on one application. No more than one license may be issued to any organization for any one period. No more than one licensee may operate or conduct a game of "beano" or "bingo" on the same premises on the same date.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits 2 or more licensees from operating games of beano or bingo on the same premises on the same date. Licensees who have access to large capacity halls may provide 3 or more consecutive games utilizing 3 or more separate organizations at the same location, thereby drawing large groups of people because of the opportunity to share in \$3,600 or more prize money. Smaller nonprofit organizations cannot compete in the same area, on the same date with these practices, thereby the purpose and intent of Maine's beano laws are being circumvented to the detriment of small organizations.
