19 20 21 22 23	Further amend the bill in section 1, in subsection 1, paragraph M, in the 4th line (page 4, line 4 in L.D.) by striking out the words and punctuation ", but not including" and inserting in their place the following: '7 but not including and'
24	STATEMENT OF FACT
25 26 27 28 29 30	The purpose of this amendment is to include finished lumber as a commodity which may be transported within a 100 mile radius without the requirement for an operating permit. Finished lumber has always enjoyed this exemption and it is not necessary to exclude it.
31 32 33 34 35 36	This amendment also corrects an inadvertant omission which removed the distance restriction for the transportation of seed, fertilizer and livestock. The amendment makes this provision consistent with the other provisions of the bill and limits the operation of these vehicles to within 50 miles of the

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farm on which the products are produced, stored or used.

The amendment also allows tractor-trailer vehicles to transport crushed rocks, gravel, loam, asphault, etc., without an operating permit. Currently only dump trucks can presently qualify for this exemption, but tractor trailers do less damage to the roads than single unit dump vehicles and deserve the exemption.
