.2 .3 .4 .5 .6 .7 .8	This bill eliminates the current redundant requirement for a separate application for those lands within the settlement corridor, 2 miles on either side of publicly maintained roads, to be entered into the Spruce-Fir Forest Protection District. Applications for lands within the settlement corridor would be due at the same time, December 1st, as are applications for all other eligible lands.
