7 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 709, 8 L.D. 1955, Bill, "AN ACT to Amend Certain Rules of 9 the Emergency Medical Services."

10 Amend the bill by striking out everything after ¹ 11 the enacting clause and inserting in its place the 12 following:

13 '32 MRSA §84, sub-§1, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1981, 14 c. 661, §2, is amended to read:

D. Regulations promulgated pursuant to this
 chapter shall include, but not be limited to, the
 following:

18 (1) The composition of regional councils
 19 and the process by which they come to be
 20 recognized as representing their regions;

21 (2) The manner in which regional councils
22 shall report their activities and finances,
23 and the manner in which those activities
24 shall be carried out under this chapter;

25 (3) The designation of regions within the 26 State;

27 (4) The requirements for licensure for all
28 vehicles, persons and services subject to
29 this chapter, and including training and
30 testing of personnel; and

31(5) Fees to be charged for licenses under32this section, except that no fee may be33charged for the licensing of emergency medi-34cal services' persons under this chapter.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 709, L.D. 1955

1	In adopting any regulation under subparagraph (4)
2	which requires services which deliver advanced
3	care to meet a specified percentage level of per-
4	formance, the regulation shall not take effect
5	until after January 1, 1986 and unless the level
6	is specified after study, in cooperation with re-
7	gional councils and local service units.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

9 This amendment replaces the bill's prohibition on 10 establishing a performance requirement for advanced 11 life support services. Instead, a regulation about a 12 performance requirement must be studied by the De-13 partment of Human Services, together with local emer-14 gency medical services units and the regional coun-15 cils, and cannot take effect before January 1, 1986.
