10 11 12	Amend the bill in section 6 in that part designated "§6681." by striking out all of subsection 1 and inserting in its place the following:
13 14 15 16 17	'1. Purpose. The Legislature finds that the best economic use of the state's shellfish resource may be enhanced by a 2-inch minimum size limit on possession of soft-shell clam shell stock in combination with other management programs.'
18 19 20 21 22	Further amend the bill in section 6 in that part designated "§6681." in subsection 4 by striking out all of the first underlined sentence (page 4, lines 23 to 28 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:
23 24 25	'Any person may possess soft-shelled clams that are less than 2 inches if beginning in the calendar year 1985 they comprise less than 5% of any bulk pile.'

1	STATEMENT OF FACT
2 3 4 5 6	The purpose of this amendment is to allow 5% of any bulk pile of soft-shell claims to fall below the 2-inch limit. The 5% limit provides adequate economic assurance to diggers who may operate on a statewide basis.
