COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "**A**" to H.P. 1507,
L.D. 1982, Bill, "AN ACT to Authorize a School Ad-
ministrative District to Reconsider the Use of the
Alternative Voting Procedure for the Adoption of its
School Budget."

Amend the bill by inserting after the enacting
clause the following:

'Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1305, first ¶, as enacted by
PL 1981, c. 693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

If requested by a written petition of at least
10% of the number of voters voting in the last guber-
natorial election in the municipalities within the
district, the board of directors shall cause the fol-
lowing article to be voted on by the voters of the
member municipalities.

"Shall School Administrative District
No.....require that the voting at future district
budget meetings and special district budget meet-
ings be done by referendum within each member mu-
nicipality of the district? Yes No "

Further amend the bill in section 1, in subsec-
tion 4, in the 12th line, (page 2, line 4 in L.D.) by
inserting after the underlined word "done" the under-
lined words 'by referendum'

Further amend the bill by renumbering the sec-
tions to read consecutively.
