Sec. 2. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Of-16 ficer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature and those reclassifications or range changes 20 which have been approved by the Department of Personnel and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.

- 24 Sec. 3. Encumbered balances at year end. 25 the end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances shall not be carried more than once. 26
- 27 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 28 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect 29 when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The Legislature has appropriated \$150,000 from the General Fund for the support of the commission during the current fiscal year. The balance of the commission's needs is to be met by an assessment paid by each hospital. Public Law 1983, chapter 107 specifies that for the period of October 1, 1983, to June 30, 1984, each hospital shall pay an assessment equal to 75% of the total annual dues and fees for which it was liable to a voluntary budget review organization during its most recent fiscal year which ended prior to July 1, 1983. Public Law 1983, chapter 107 further specifies that this assessment is to be paid to the Health Care Finance Commission Fund in 3 equal installments due on or before November 1, 1983, January 1, 1984, and April 1, 1984.

The purpose of this bill is to allocate the funds paid to the Health Care Finance Commission Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1984. It is imperative that this action be taken immediately in order to permit the commission to continue its efforts to implement the hospital financing system without interruption. Any significant delay will prevent the commission from retaining additional staff and taking the other steps necessary to implement the system by the dates specified in Public Law 1983, chapter 107.
