Whereas, a Maine Superior Court enjoined the Department of Human Services to continue such coverage, but the Federal Government removed the case to federal court and continues to seek an end to such coverage; and

Whereas, in the event that the Federal Government successfully forces the State to discontinue Medicaid coverage, approximately 180 seriously ill, elderly and disabled people would be left without sufficient funds or coverage to pay their medical expenses; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

 - For an individual who resides in an foster home, boarding home or nursing home, as defined in section 1812-A, in addition to the benefits provided herein under paragraphs A and C, provide sufficient income to allow the individual for personal needs an amount equal to at least \$30 a month, plus an amount sufficient to meet the individual's medical expenses, including insurance premiums, not covered by insurance or Medicaid, plus an amount sufficient to meet monthly per resident payment rate as established by the department of the adult foster home or boarding home in which the individual resides; and

STATEMENT OF FACT

2	This bill clarifies the present law providing for
