17 18 19 20	AN ACT to Enable the City of Portland to Charge Reasonable Interest on Delinquent Sewer Accounts.
, 21 , 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	Sec. 1. P&SL 1891, c. 184, §5, as repealed and replaced by P&SL 1961, c. 116, is amended to read:
, 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35	Sec. 5. Liens. All assessments made under this act shall create a lien upon each and every lot or parcel of land so assessed, which lien shall continue for one year after said assessments are payable, and within 10 days after they are made the clerk of said city shall make out a list of all such assessments, the amount of each assessment, and the name of the person, if known, against whom the same is assessed, to be by him certified; and he shall deliver the same to the treasurer of said city, and if said assess- ments are not paid within 3 months from the date of

1 said assessments, then the treasurer shall proceed to 2 collect said assessments, with or without interest at 3 a rate of not more than 6% per annum not to exceed the highest lawful rate set by the Treasurer of State 4 5 for municipal taxes, as the municipal officers of 6 said city shall determine, and with costs and incidental charges, in the manner provided for collection 7 8 of taxes by enforcement of lien procedure, which lien 9 shall be enforced not less than 8 months nor more 10 than one year from the date said assessments are 11 made.

Sec. 2. P&SL 1891, c. 184, §6, first sentence, as repealed and replaced by P&SL 1961, c. 116, is amended to read:

Any person to whom the right by law belongs may, 15 16 at any time within 18 months from the date of the 17 filing of said lien certificate, redeem such real estate by paying to the treasurer the sum for which the 18 19 was placed on such real estate, with or without lien 20 interest at a the rate of not more than 6% per annum 21 the municipal officers of said city shall deteras 22 mine, with costs of redemption.

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23 Sec. 3. P&SL 1891, c. 184, §7, as repealed and 24 replaced by P&SL 1961, c. 116, is amended to read:

25 Sec. 7. Civil action for collection. If said assessments are not paid, and said city does not pro-26 ceed to collect said assessments by said lien proce-dure, or is in any manner delayed or defeated in com-27 28 29 pleting said lien procedure, then the said city in 30 name of the inhabitants of said city, or in the the 31 name of such city, may sue for and maintain a civil 32 action against the party so assessed for the amount of said assessment as for money paid, laid out 33 and 34 expended, in any court competent to try the same, and 35 in such action may recover the amount of such assessinterest at the rate as the municipal 36 with 6% ment 37 officers of said city shall determine on the same 38 from the date of said assessment and costs; provided, 39 however, that if such city should in any manner ac-40 cept less than the amount of said assessment with 1 such interest thereon as may have been charged for 2 its right, title and interest in the real estate, the 3 party so assessed shall be under no personal liabili-4 ty for the remainder of said assessment.

STATEMENT OF FACT

6 The City of Portland, under Private and Special 7 Law of 1891, is authorized to charge interest on delinquent sewer accounts only up to a rate of 6% per 8 9 annum. The First Regular Session of the 111th Legis-10 lature amended the Revised Statutes Title 30, section 11 4355, to permit other municipalities to charge interat the rate for unpaid taxes. This bill grants 12 est 13 the same authority to the City of Portland.

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
