12 13 14	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
15 16 17	Whereas, the United States Unemployment Tax Act requires state unemployment laws to conform to federal law; and
18 19 20	Whereas, noncompliance can cause employers to lose federal tax credits for contributions made to the Unemployment Compensation Fund; and
21 22 23 24	Whereas, this bill corrects an inadvertent error that caused the United States Department of Labor to notify the State that its program no longer complies with federal law; and
25 26 27 28 29 30	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

2	STATEMENT OF FACT
3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	Section 1 of the bill corrects an inadvertent change made during the last legislative session that has caused the United States Department of Labor to notify the State that its unemployment laws are no longer in conformity with the United States Unemployment Tax Act. Unless corrected, this nonconformity can cause loss of federal tax credits to employers. This amendment adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to assure prompt compliance with federal standards.
