- 3 3. Rules. To make rules and regulations, after 4 hearing, to include the disbursement of funds 5 subcontracting agencies and organizations, the uses 6 for which the moneys provided to subcontracting agen-7 cies and organizations may be expended, and reports 8 by subcontracting agencies to the Division of Commu-9 nity Services concerning the results of 10 weatherization and fuel assistance programs. Rules 11 promulgated pursuant to this subsection shall be sub-12 ject to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 13 5, chapter 375, subchapter IV. 29 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill proposes a modest expansion of the types of eligible home repairs under the weatherization program operated by the Division of Community Services and community action agencies and appropriates funds for that expansion.

Community action agencies which conduct and perform weatherization services for elderly, handicapped

and other low income people frequently find that minor housing repairs are necessary in order to make the housing unit habitable and even to make the energy conservation measures of long-lasting value. Examples are roof repair or replacement of defective and dangerous stairs.

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The current state appropriation for housing repair and weatherization is inadequate to meet the documented need. In addition, current state and federal regulations prohibit all but a very few housing repairs during the weatherization process.

There is no other available source of funds single-family dwellings for this type of housing repair. The Farmer's Home Administration grant and loan program for this purpose has almost disappeared. Other housing rehabilitation programs, such as those operated by the housing authority, are geared to rental units only. The low income people eligible for weatherization program do not qualify for traditional financing in most cases. The proposed program provides a greatly needed and efficient means of proving Maine's housing stock by regional agencies that have developed expertise in housing repair due to their work in the weatherization program and their new role in Central Maine Power Company's Energy Conservation Loan Program recently authorized by the Public Utilities Commission.

The proposed appropriation of \$1,000,000 is expected to serve 2,400 homes at an average cost of \$400 a unit.

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
