Whereas, there are currently or will soon be several vacancies on the Board of Trustees; and

Whereas, continuation of the current mandatory retirement age will deny the service of many qualified and experienced persons to the Board of Trustees; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Trustees shall retire on reaching the age of 70-

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to remove the retirement age for University of Maine trustees. Currently, trustees are required to retire at the age of 70 years. In 1977, the Legislature enacted a law that prohibited mandatory retirement ages for employees in the public sector. The Private and Special Law governing the University of Maine, however, was not amended with respect to the retirement age for trustees of the university. This bill makes the University of Maine retirement provision for trustees consistent with the state law.
