23 24	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §4552, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 770, §28, is amended to read:
25	§4552. Policy
26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34	To protect the public health, safety and welfare, it is declared to be the policy of this State to keep continually in review all practices infringing on the basic human right to a life with dignity, and the causes of such practices, so that corrective measures may, where possible, be promptly recommended and im- plemented, and to prevent discrimination in employ- ment, housing or access to public accommodations on account of race, color, sex, physical or mental hand-

icap, religion, ancestry or national origin and in employment, discrimination on account of age; and to prevent discrimination in the extension of credit on account of age, race, color, sex, marital status, religion, ancestry er, national origin and physical handicap.

9§4595. Right to freedom from discrimination solely10on the basis of age, race, color, sex, mari-11tal status, ancestry, religion, national ori-12gin or physical handicap in any credit13transaction

14 The opportunity for every individual to be ex-15 tended credit without discrimination solely because 16 of any one or more of the following factors: Age; 17 race; color; sex; marital status; ancestry; religion 18 er; national origin; or physical handicap is recog-19 nized as and declared to be a civil right.

22 §4596. Unlawful credit extension discrimination

It shall be is unlawful credit discrimination for 23 24 any creditor to refuse the extension of credit to any 25 person solely on the basis of any one or more of the following factors: Age; race; color; sex; marital 26 27 status; ancestry; religion er; national origin; or 28 physical handicap in any credit transaction. It 29 shall is not be unlawful credit discrimination to comply with the terms and conditions of any bona fide 30 group credit life, accident and health insurance 31 plan, for a financial institution extending credit to 32 33 a married person to require both the husband and the 34 wife to sign a note and a mortgage and to deny credit 35 to persons under the age of 18 or to consider a 36 person's age in determining the terms upon which credit will be extended. 37
