SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to S.P. 752, L.D. 2055,  
8 Bill, "AN ACT To Amend the Liquor Laws to Permit the  
9 Sale of Beer and Wine at Outdoor Stadiums."

Amend the bill by striking out all of the emer-  
11 gency preamble.

12

Further amend the bill in section 13 by adding at  
13 the end the following:

14

'4. Food availability. Food shall be for sale  
15 to the public at all times that beer and wine are for  
16 sale.

17

5. Consumption of beer and wine. Beer and wine  
18 may be consumed in the spectator stands at an outdoor  
19 stadium only with the approval of and in accordance  
20 with the rules of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages.

21

Sec. 14. Application limited. This Act shall  
22 remain in effect only until September 30, 1985 during  
23 which time the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages shall  
24 evaluate the effectiveness of this law and make a  
25 written report to the 112th Legislature.'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of the  
27 last paragraph before the statement of fact.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment is similar to the law enacted in the 107th Legislature, 1975, authorizing the licensing of indoor tennis clubs, indoor ice skating clubs and golf course clubs for the sale of alcoholic beverages. At that time, the Legislature placed a 2-year limit on the law and required the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages to evaluate the effectiveness of the law.

This amendment would impose a September 30, 1985, expiration date on the law and similarly requires the bureau to submit a written report on the effectiveness of the law. This would result in further legislative review and approval before the law is extended beyond September 30, 1985.
