7 8 9	SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to S.P. 752, L.D. 2055, Bill, "AN ACT To Amend the Liquor Laws to Permit the Sale of Beer and Wine at Outdoor Stadiums."
10 11	Amend the bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble.
12 13	Further amend the bill in section 13 by adding at the end the following:
14 15 16	'4. Food availability. Food shall be for sale to the public at all times that beer and wine are for sale.
17 18 19 20	5. Consumption of beer and wine. Beer and wine may be consumed in the spectator stands at an outdoor stadium only with the approval of and in accordance with the rules of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages.
21 22 23 24 25 26	Sec. 14. Monitoring; recommendations. The Bureau of Liquor Enforcement shall monitor the implementation and application of this Act and shall report its findings together with the recommendations to the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and to the 112th Legislature.
27 28 29 30 31	Sec. 15. Application limited. This Act shall remain in effect only until September 30, 1985 during which time the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages shall evaluate the effectiveness of this law and make a written report to the 112th Legislature.
32 33	Further amend the bill by striking out all of the last paragraph before the statement of fact.

SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to S.P. 752, L.D. 2055

1	STATEMENT OF FACT
2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	This amendment is similar to the law enacted in the 107th Legislature, 1975, authorizing the licensing of indoor tennis clubs, indoor ice skating clubs and golf course clubs for the sale of alcoholic beverages. At that time, the Legislature placed a 2-year limit on the law and required the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages to evaluate the effectiveness of the law.
10 11 12 13 14	This amendment would impose a September 30, 1985, expiration date on the law and similarly requires the bureau to submit a written report on the effectiveness of the law. This would result in further legislative review and approval before the law is extended beyond September 30, 1985.
16 17 18 19 20	This amendment also provides that the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement shall monitor the implementation and application of the cost and shall report to the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and the 112th Legislature.
