SENATE AMENDMENT " C " to S.P. 752, L.D. 2055,
Bill, "AN ACT To Amend the Liquor Laws to Permit the
Sale of Beer and Wine at Outdoor Stadiums."

Amend the bill by striking out all of the emer-
gency preamble.

Further amend the bill in section 13 by adding at
the end the following:

'4. Food availability. Food shall be for sale
to the public at all times that beer and wine are for
sale.

5. Consumption of beer and wine. Beer and wine
may be consumed in the spectator stands at an outdoor
stadium only with the approval of and in accordance
with the rules of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages.

Sec. 14. Monitoring; recommendations. The Bu-
reau of Liquor Enforcement shall monitor the imple-
mentation and application of this Act and shall re-
port its findings together with the recommendations
to the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and to the 112th
Legislature.

Sec. 15. Application limited. This Act shall
remain in effect only until September 30, 1985 during
which time the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages shall
evaluate the effectiveness of this law and make a
written report to the 112th Legislature.'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of the
last paragraph before the statement of fact.

SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to S.P. 752, L.D. 2055

1 STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This amendment is similar to the law enacted in
3 the 107th Legislature, 1975, authorizing the licens-
4 ing of indoor tennis clubs, indoor ice skating clubs
5 and golf course clubs for the sale of alcoholic bev-
6 erages. At that time, the Legislature placed a
7 2-year limit on the law and required the Bureau of
8 Alcoholic Beverages to evaluate the effectiveness of
9 the law.

10 This amendment would impose a September 30, 1985,
11 expiration date on the law and similarly requires the
12 bureau to submit a written report on the effective-
13 ness of the law. This would result in further legis-
14 lative review and approval before the law is extended
15 beyond September 30, 1985.

16 This amendment also provides that the Bureau of
17 Liquor Enforcement shall monitor the implementation
18 and application of the cost and shall report to the
19 Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and the 112th Legisla-
20 ture.
