21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	Sec. 1. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-B, sub-§3, as en- acted by P&SL 1967, c. 229, §3, is amended to read:

The head of each campus shall be the chief administrative and ed- ucational officer thereof and shall be <u>called the</u> <u>president</u> . The president shall be responsible for the day to day operation and development of its the academic program within the limits defined by the beard of trustees and the chancellor for the campus of which he is president; and in addition, shall ex- ercise such rights and privileges as are generally recognized in the administering of admissions, cur- riculum development, extra curricular programs, leng

1 rang long-range planning within the framework of the 2 overall university plan, and supervision of faculty. 3 The president shall perform his duties within the 4 limits defined by the board of trustees and the chan-5 cellor and consistent with the direction and counsel 6 of the board of overseers for the campus. 7 Sec. 2. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-B, sub-§§5, 5-A 8 and 5-B are enacted to read: 9 5. Boards of overseers; duties. The boards of overseers for each campus shall have the following 10 duties and responsibilities for the respective cam-11 12 pus: 13 When a vacancy occurs in the position of Α. president, to recommend through the chancellor to 14 the board of trustees a nominee for the position 15 16 of president; 17 B. To conduct or oversee a biannual performance review of the president and to relay the results 18 19 through the chancellor to the board of trustees; 20 C. In consultation with the president and consistent with the overall plan for the university 21 system approved by the chancellor and the board 22 of trustees, to develop a mission statement and a 23 long-range plan for the campus. The overseers shall review the mission statement and the long-24 25 26 range plan biannually; 27 D. To review and approve the budget developed by 28 the president for the campus and to submit the budget to the chancellor and the board of trust-29 30 ees; E. To review and approve major academic policies 31 32 developed by the president, such as the addition or termination of academic programs, the stan-dards for admission and standards for receipt of 33 34 35 degrees from the campus; 36 F. To serve as a resource for the president in 37 developing and implementing criteria and policies 38 to assure excellence in programs, teaching and scholarship at the undergraduate and graduate 39 40 level;

1 G. To serve as a resource for the president in 2 developing and implementing criteria and policies 3 to assure excellence in research at the campus; H. To serve as a resource for the president in developing and implementing criteria and policies 4 5 6 to assure excellence in public service programs 7 and activities provided by the campus; 8 I. To pursue on behalf of the campus endowments, 9 grants, gifts, contributions and other private funding support for the benefit of the campus; 10 11 and 12 J. To assist the president in establishing and maintaining proper relations between the campus 13 14 and its programs and the public in order to serve 15 the needs and interests of both. 16 5-A. Boards of overseers; purpose. The purpose 17 of the establishment of boards of overseers is to maintain, support and strengthen the unified system 18 19 of the University of Maine, established by Private 20 and Special Law 1865, chapter 532, and as amended by Private and Special Law 1967, chapter 229. 21 5-B. Boards of overseers; establishment. There shall be established boards of overseers for each of 22 23 24 the 7 campuses of the University of Maine: The University of Southern Maine; the University of Maine at Orono; the University of Maine at Augusta; the Uni-25 26 27 versity of Maine at Farmington; the University of 28 Maine at Fort Kent; the University of Maine at Presque Isle; and the University of Maine at Machias. 29 30 Each board of overseers shall consist of 5 members. Three members shall be appointed by the Governor, 31 subject to review by the joint standing committee of 32 33 the Legislature having jurisdiction over education 34 and confirmation by the Legislature. Two members shall be appointed by the president of the campus for 35 36 which the board has responsibility. Initial appointments shall be made for the following terms: For the 37 38 3 overseers for each campus appointed by the Governor, one shall serve a 3-year term, one shall serve a 39 4-year term and one shall serve a 5-year term. 40 For 41 the overseers appointed by the president, one shall 42 serve a 3-year term and one shall serve 4-year а

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Thereafter all overseers shall serve 5-year 1 term. 2 terms. No overseer may be appointed for more than 2 3 successive terms. Vacancies shall be filled in like 4 manner as the original appointment for the unexpired 5 balance of the term. If the unexpired balance of the 6 term is 2 or more years, that term shall be deemed a 7 complete term for purposes of the limitation on suc-8 cessive terms. Each board of overseers shall select 9 a chairman. Each board shall select one member to 10 represent the overseers as a nonvoting member of the 11 board of trustees. Overseers shall serve without pay, but shall receive their actual traveling and 12 13 other expenses incurred in the performance of their 14 official duties.

STATEMENT OF FACT

16 This bill creates boards of overseers for each 17 campus in the University of Maine system. The boards 18 would be subsidiary to the centralized authority and 19 function of the board of trustees. Overseers would 20 work with the president of each campus. The role of 21 boards of overseers within the university system 22 would be:

23 1. To more effectively secure funding and advo-24 cacy for the university system;

2. To encourage and ensure long and short-range26 planning at the campus level;

27 3. To strengthen links between the campus and
28 various constituents such as business, agriculture
29 and labor;

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4. To be a resource for the president in making
31 policy decisions and to provide the perspective of
32 the community for those decisions; and

5. To aid each campus in performing at a level
of excellence in every endeavor, consistent with its
mission and the needs of its constituents.

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
