20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22 23	Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1913-A, sub-§1, ¶¶G and H, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 318, §3, are amended to read:
24 25	G. Hand-held or similar signs not affixed to the ground or buildings; and

Signs bearing political messages relating to an election, primary or referendum, provided that these signs may not be placed within the right-of-way prior to 6 weeks before the election, primary or referendum to which they relate and must be removed by the candidate or political committee not later than one week thereafter; and

- Sec. 2. 23 MRSA §1913-A, sub-§1, ¶I is enacted
 to read:
 - I. Temporary signs may be erected by owners of roadside stands providing directions to their places of business which offer for sale native agricultural products, provided:
 - (1) Temporary signs are not installed before June 1st and are removed by owner before October 15th;
 - (2) Temporary signs are neat in appearance, clearly readable to the passing motorist and do not exceed a total of 6 square feet in surface area;
 - (3) Temporary signs are placed off the shoulder of roadway with the opportunity to remain within the public way;
 - (4) Temporary signs number no more than 2, one in each direction on either side of the roadway located within 300 feet of the principal building or auxiliary structure where the agricultural business is carried on or practiced; and
 - (5) Such signs are located within the municipality where the agricultural business is located.
- 26 Sec. 3. 23 MRSA §1922, as repealed and replaced by PL 1981, c. 318, §4, is amended to read:

§1922. Local ordinance

This chapter shall not supersede the provisions of any other statute, regulation, ordinance or resolution, the requirements of which are more strict than those of this chapter and not inconsistent therewith, whether such ordinance, bylaw, regulation, resolution or statute was enacted before or after the effective date of this chapter. It shall not be inconsistent with this chapter if such statute, regulation, ordinance or resolution prohibits official business directional signs. Local ordinances shall

not prohibit the designation of fixed locations on premise and off for sign displays at and near seasonal farmers' markets, which are situated either on public or private property in the municipality.

STATEMENT OF FACT

With passage of the Maine Traveler Information Services Act, Revised Statutes, Title 23, chapter 21, strict standards were established governing outdoor advertising and business sign placement. The agricultural sector previously retained under state law special consideration for signs announcing sales of agricultural products. This privilege was eliminated in 1978 when the so called "billboard" law became effective.

This bill proposal restores special consideration to Maine farmers, many of whom offer for sale their agricultural products seasonally at farmers' markets or roadside stands.

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
