STATEMENT OF FACT

The original law required 8 of the 9 trustees to reside in districts consistent with existing Senate precinct, the 9th seat was at large, lines. The redistricting Act creates Senate lines that now include Senate representation outside of Cumberland County; the new precinct lines also establish more than 8 Senate Districts. The proposed bill maintains 9 trustees and allocates them fairly among 7 precincts, following constant municipality lines, and provides for 2 at-large seats. The trustees will continue to be appointed by the county commissioners. In essence, the bill is an "errors and omissions" situation in which there must be modification because of redistricting law passed in 1983.
