AN ACT to Exempt Nonprofit Emergency  
Feeding Organizations from the Sales Tax.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

36 MRSA §1760, sub-§46 is enacted to read:

46. Emergency household and sanitary supplies. Sales to nonprofit organizations of essential household and sanitary supplies for distribution to individuals in emergency situations, or for use by the nonprofit organization.

1 STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The purpose of this bill is to allow certain non-  
3 profit organizations which provide foodstuffs and  
4 other vital items to individuals in emergency situa-  
5 tions an exemption from the sales tax on essential  
6 household and sanitary supplies which are given to  
7 those individuals or which are used by the organiza-  
8 tions.
