**AN ACT Making Additional Allocations for
the Expenditures of State Government in Response
to an Increase in the United States Department
of Energy's Grant Award for the Program of
Weatherization Assistance for Low-income
Persons for Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1984.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
lature do not become effective until 90 days after
adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain previously unanticipated reve-
nues are expected to be made available to the State
by the Federal Government as a result of an increase
in the grant award from the United States Department
of Energy for the Program of Weatherization Assis-
tance for Low-income Persons, and those revenues must
be expended by March 31, 1984; and

1 STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The purpose of this bill is to authorize the ac-
3 ceptance of and to allocate expected additional fed-
4 eral revenues projected to become available to and
5 required to be expended by March 31, 1984, by the
6 State as a result of an increase in the United States
7 Department of Energy's grant award for the Program of
8 Weatherization Assistance for Low-income Persons.
9 Amounts are expected to supplement this existing fed-
10 erally funded program.

11 This bill allocates, by line, an additional
12 \$100,000 in a federal grant to an existing program
13 which is expected to be made available in state fis-
14 cal year 1984 as a result of an increase in the
15 United States Department of Energy's grant award.
