STATE OF MAINE 3 4 SENATE 5 111TH LEGISLATURE 6 SECOND REGULAR SESSION 7 SENATE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 797, L.D. 2132, Bill, "AN ACT to Allow Elderly Persons to have Pets 8 in Public Housing." 9 Amend the bill in that part designated "§5171." 10 in subsection 2 by adding at the end the following 11 12 sentence: 13 'Pet owners are encouraged to have their dogs and 14 cats neutered or spayed. Further amend the bill in that part designated "§5172." in subsection 2 in the 2nd line (page 2, line 18 in L.D.) by inserting after the underlined word "establish" the underlined word 'reasonable'and 15 16 17 18 by inserting after the underlined word "guidelines" the underlined words 'on an interim basis pending is-suance of the federal regulations' 19 20 21 22 Further amend the bill in that part designated "§5172." in subsection 2 in paragraph B in the last 23 line by inserting before the period the following 24 25 words 'or a nuisance to other occupants' Further amend the bill in that part designated 26 " $\S5172$ ." by adding at the end a new subsection to 27 read: 28 '3. Liability. The local housing authority shall not be liable for personal or property damages 29 30 31 caused by any pet in the rental housing accommoda-32 tion.

1	STATEMENT OF FACT
2	This amendment clarifies that neutering of dogs
3	and cats is not mandated but it is encouraged because
4	of the effects on the behavior of pets.
5	On February 28, the United States Department of
6	Housing and Urban Development issued a notice
7	(H-84-10 HUD) to all owners and managers of federally
8	assisted and insured rental housing for the elderly
9	and handicapped regarding pet ownership in such hous-
10	ing. It informs the owner or managers that, prior to
11	issuance of the federal regulations, "the owners and
12	managers of covered projects who consider it neces-
13	sary to adopt reasonable rules limiting the keeping
14	of pets by tenants may do so on an interim basis
15	pending issuance of the regulations." This existing
16	provision would therefore permit owners or managers
17	to develop just one set of rules regarding ownership.
18	This amendment also specifies that rules must be
19	reasonable so that they would not in essence prohibit
20	older people from being able to have pets.
21	This would expand the conditions concerning the
22	removal of pets which may be included in rules or
23	guidelines established by the owner or manager.
24	This amendment clarifies the issue of the liabil-
25	ity of the management of the public housing. Another
26	state has enacted a similar provision in their legis-
27	lation.
