17 18 19	AN ACT to Allow Elderly Persons to have Pets in Public Housing.
20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
. 22	22 MRSA c. 1457-B is enacted to read:
23	CHAPTER 1457-B
. 24	PUBLIC HOUSING FOR THE ELDERLY
25	§5171. Definitions
26	As used in this chapter, unless the context indi-
27	cates otherwise, the following terms have the follow-
28	ing meanings.
29	1. Elderly. "Elderly" means a person who has:

1	A. Attained the age of 62 years; or
2	B. Attained the age of 55 years and who is, due
3	to disability, receiving federal disability pay-
4	ments, such as Supplemental Security Income.
5	2. Pet. "Pet" means any domesticated dog, cat
6	or bird, or aquarium.
7	3. Public housing. "Public housing" means hous-
8	ing which is funded in whole or in part by any state
9	or federal money, grants or programs.
10	§5172. Pets
11 12	Pets shall be allowed in public housing for the elderly according to the following provisions.
13	1. Pets allowed. An owner, manager, governmental
14	entity or any other entity having control over any
15	public housing shall not prohibit the keeping of a
16	pet by any elderly resident of that housing.
17	2. Limitations. The owner or manager of any pub-
18	lic housing unit may establish rules or guidelines
19	concerning the keeping of pets by elderly persons,
20	including, but not limited to:
21 22	A. Limitations on the number of pets which may be kept; and
23	B. Removal of pets which destroy or damage prop-
24	erty not belonging to the elderly person or which
25	pose health, safety or sanitary hazards.
26	STATEMENT OF FACT
27	The purpose of this bill is to permit elderly
28	persons living in any form of public housing to keep
29	pets. Other states have already enacted similar pro-
30	visions and have recognized beneficial results in
31	terms of both the mental and physical well-being of
32	elderly residents.
